

Making laws in Australia

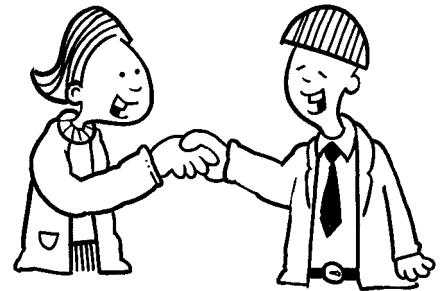
VOTERS

- citizens of Australia over 18
- can vote for people to represent them



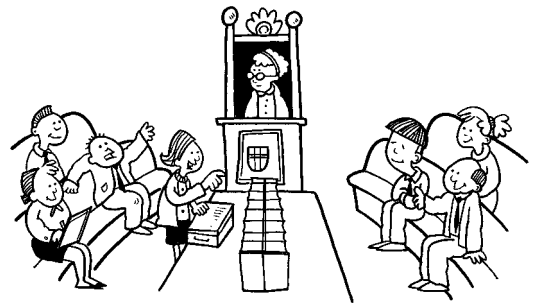
REPRESENTATIVES

- listen to what the voters want
- speak for the voters in Parliament



PARLIAMENT

- makes up a possible law (called a Bill) for the good of the voters
- discusses it
- may make changes to it



If Parliament agrees on a Bill the GOVERNOR-GENERAL signs it and it becomes a law.
